Japan Film Festival 2009 presented by the Japan America Media Association is pleased to announce the lineup for this year's festival. The festival will begin on Friday, April 10th through 16th at Laemmle's Monica 4-Plex in Santa Monica, April 17th through 19th at Downtown Independent in Downtown LA. We will be showing 22 feature films including those that will be North American or Los Angeles Premiers.
