The pre-conference meeting in Plymouth will bring together geographers from around the world who work with Indigenous peoples, to aid in creating a network and to share our research and experiences. This meeting will allow for informal gatherings and exploration of the local area and history. While in Plymouth we will also be meeting with the local Native American community, the Mashpee Wampanoag. At the AAG annual meeting in Boston, the Indigenous Peoples Specialty Group will be sponsoring a symposium comprised of paper sessions, panels and a plenary speaker, Dr. Daniel Wildcat from Haskell Indian Nations University, on 15-16 April. Other Indigenous focused sessions will follow on the remaining days of the AAG conference.
