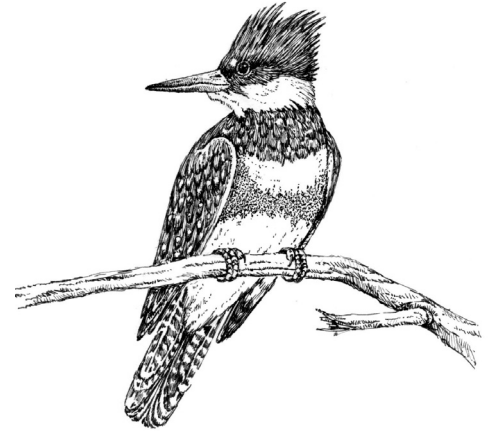


Jacques Manonian Memorial Scholarship

The Jacques Manonian Memorial Scholarship is designed to assist student participation in the Wilderness and Civilization program.

The Wilderness and Civilization Program

The two-semester Wilderness and Civilization program is based at the University of Montana, Missoula, and combines classroom learning and field experience for an in-depth exploration of wildland conservation and the human-nature relationship. Coursework is interdisciplinary, drawing from policy and current events, art and biology, and literature and Native American studies. The program combines the strengths of experiential learning, small class size, dedicated faculty, and internships. Wilderness and Civilization students receive an undergraduate minor in Wilderness Studies that complements any major.

Every year students from around the country participate in Wilderness and Civilization through National Student Exchange or other exchange programs.
