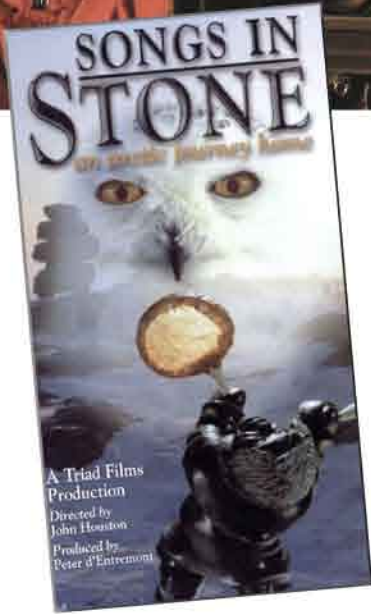

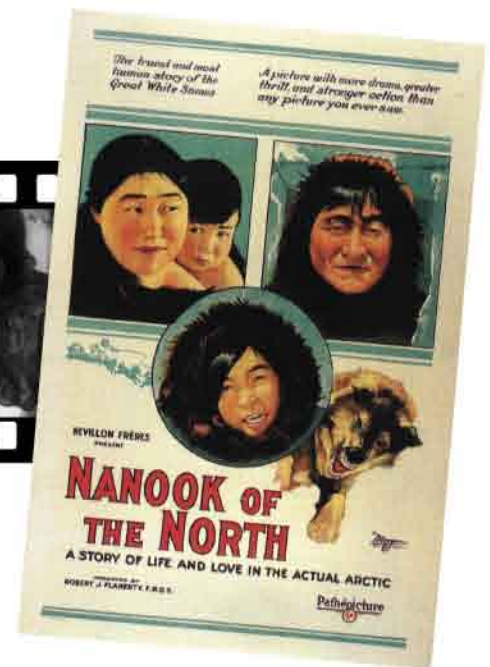


## Songs in Stone: An Arctic Journey Home

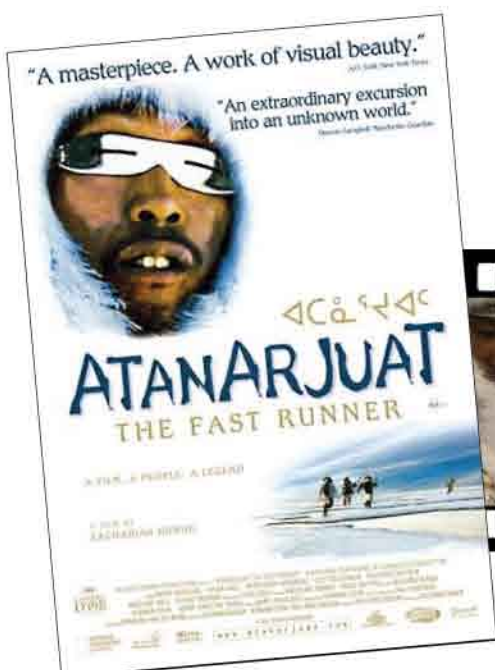
## Inuit Film Day
