PAUL AUSTER

Novelist and director Paul Auster is the author of *The New York Trilogy* (1985-6), *Moon Palace* (1989), *The Music of Chance* (1990), *The Book of Illusions* (2002), and *The Brooklyn Follies* (2005). A native of New Jersey, Auster studied at Columbia University before relocating to Paris, where he translated French literature including works by Stéphane Mallarmé and Joseph Joubert. A former vice-president of PEN American Center and current member, he is recipient of several awards for both writing and film directing. His first film, *Smoke* (1995), which he wrote and co-directed, won the Independent Spirit Award for Best First Screenplay. Other screenplays include *The Music of Chance* (1993), *Blue in the Face* (1995), and *Lulu on the Bridge* (1998). He is also the author of numerous volumes of poetry, essays, and such memoirs as *The Invention of Solitude* (1982) and *Winter Journal* (2013).
