





























Meaning	Current Icon	New Icon	Benefits of switch
Repository		Stays the same	
Collection			Archive box also used for “container”, makes more sense as “container. New icon is more representational of a grouping.
Digital Object			Current icon commonly represents “image” or “photo” to the user.
Unprocessed material			Current icon doesn't carry meaning. New icon indicates “in process” or “being worked on” to a user (wrench = work, construction)
Names			Current icon is awkward. New icon represents “ID” or “Identifying information”.
Subjects			
Record Group			Current icon commonly represents “social media” or “share” to the user.
Record Group Subcomponent			Current icon commonly represents “settings” to the user.
Series, sub-series, part of collection			Current icon also used for single item or collection subcomponent. New icon represents group of materials.
Collection subcomponent		Stays the same
